

Olivia Gibbs - For the fantastic effort she has been putting into improving her times tables. Keep up the good work!


Paige Simmons - For her outstanding attitude to all of her learning. She is always listening, working hard and trying her best.

Saturday November 30th 2019
from 10am - 3pm. At one of these sites:

Site 1. Knightshayes
Come and plant a landmark avenue of 18 oaks and help to restore a public woodland by planting 200 native deciduous trees at this beautiful and historic site. Meet: Very top of the Visitors' Car Park, Knightshayes, Bolham, Tiverton, Devon, EX16 7RG. Parking is free for Tree Team volunteers. **Time: 10am - 3pm**

Site 2. Moorhayes Farm
We will be planting a wildlife corridor of 300 trees, to join up two existing woodlands. Meet: Moorhayes Farm, Washfield, Tiverton, EX16 9RF. **Time: 10am - 3pm**

Site 3. Hackpen Natural Burial Ground
Open up a beautiful, peaceful spot to the community as a new green burial site. Meet: Hackpen Hill (sw side) nr Ashill EX15 5LU. Postcode doesn't bring you to exact spot, but look out for Tree Planting signs. **Time: 10am - 3pm** (NB: there is no toilet or kitchen at this site, but there will be a gazebo for shelter)

What to bring
Warm, waterproof clothing, wellies or boots and gloves.
A spade if you have one.
A packed lunch.
Cakes or biscuits to share?
Sites 1&2 will provide tea and coffee, but there's no facilities at site 3.
An extra flask wouldn't go amiss.

Children? Dogs? Friends?
The more the merrier, but please confirm with tivertontreeteam@gmail.com which site you're coming to and how many people you are. Children are very welcome, as long as they're accompanied by an adult who is responsible for their well-being at all times. Well-behaved dogs welcome.

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KNITTING CHALLENGE

Hello, Bolham School pupils, FOBS, Knitters and Friends! Devon County Show have set us a challenge! They want the good people of Devon to help celebrate their **125th Show on 21st to 23rd May 2020** by smashing the current Guinness Book of records longest Knitted Bunting Record.

It is also the 100th anniversary of the WI, and the 10th anniversary of the Knutty Knitters.

The completed bunting will be displayed in the Craft and Garden Tent at the show. The bunting needs to be received in Silverton, the collection point, by Friday 24th April, 2020.

Claudette Harrower, Bolham Primary School Governor (Safeguarding), Tiverton Almshouse Trust (Director), Tiverton Volunteer Litter Pickers (Chair) and Tiverton Town Councillor (Westexe) has sought the assistance of these colleagues and friends. The Salvation Army, The Heathcoat Centre, local groups and churches and many individuals to help. But not just to make bunting!

Claudette will pick up completed Flags from Bolham School on Monday 20th April 2020. It was pointed out to her by ladies at Greenway Court that they wanted the knitting to be more meaningful. With this in mind, she contacted Deborah Custance Baker, DCC who readily agreed that the bunting, after being displayed, could be returned to the knitters to be made into blankets, clothing etc for children who are living in refugee camps throughout the world. In other words, recycled for practical use. This will be achieved by asking the knitters to put their bunting into a box, stating the number of pieces collected, a contact name and number and Claudette will collect it from Silverton and return it. Or, Claudette can leave it at Silverton for Deborah and her team to redistribute it from there.

Perhaps we can start a new generation of Knitters at Bolham Primary School?

There are two simple patterns to follow. You will need DK 4MM (Size 8) needles and any colour wool. We need 8km in total (just under 5 miles), just under 31,200 knitted flags. Each flag must be no more than 8" across the top and no more than 92 on the diagonal. If some of us could be clever and knit the letters T I V E R T O N on 8 of their flags, that would really help! The team at Silverton will attach them to the tape for display.

Patterns - Basic Bunting:

pssso - pass slip stitch over

Cast on 31 or 41 stitches (depending on thickness of wool)

Knit 4 rows

Knit 1, slip 1, knit 1, pssso knit 25/35, k2 tog k1 (29/39 stitches)

Knit 3 rows

K1, slip 1, knit 1 pssso, knit 23/33, K2 tog, k1

Knit 3 rows, knitting 3 rows between each decrease row, until 5 stitches remain and after 3 knit rows knit 1, slip 1, pssso, k1 (3 stitches)

Knit 3 rows, slip 1, k2 tog, pssso

Fasten off

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Bunting with eyelets Cast on 31 or 41 stitches

1. Knit one row
2. Knit 1, yarn over, k2 tog, yarn over, k2tog to end
3. Knit 2 rows
4. K1, pssso, knit to last 3 stitches, k2 tog, k1
5. Knit 3 rows
6. K1, pssso, knit to last 3 stitches, k2 tog, k1
7. Knit 3 rows
8. Repeat this decrease pattern until 5 stitches remain and 3 knit rows have been worked
9. K1, slip 1, k2 tog, pssso
10. Knit 3 rows
11. Slip1, k2tog, pssso
12. Fasten off and cut yarn
