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
BOLHAM BEES




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CLASS 3C'S ANGLO SAXON LIFE WORKSHOP AT TIVERTON MUSEUM

We were also given an opportunity to explore other exhibits in the museum with our favourite being the Tivvy Bumper!














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DEVON & SOMERSET FIRE SERVICE VISIT

Today, Jon from the Fire and Rescue Service came to talk to KS1 and Year 5 about fire safety. He showed us how to ring 999 (or 112) and reminded us of the importance of knowing our home address in case we need to ring 999 - <u>does your child know their address?</u> In addition, he told the Year 5's it would be really handy if they knew their postcode. He also explained how to use the 'Just Three Words' App. - do you have the App?

Jon also spoke to us about smoke alarms and the importance of testing them once a month - have you tested your smoke alarms recently?

He reminded us about safety around matches and lighters and the importance of switching off electrical equipment at the socket - do you do this?

In addition, Year 5 learnt to avoid plugging high powered electrical equipment into extension leads and adapters and to ensure you have an escape plan - do you have one? They also learnt that most house fires start in the kitchen and that, if they had to evacuate.....GET DOWN, GET OUT, STAY OUT, RING 999!
