

For Science Week, Class 3 conducted the famous cola & mento experiment! They also created some lovely flowers using tissue paper and card for their unfolding flowers in water experiment.











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BRITISH SCIENCE WEEK IN CLASS 4C

This week for British Science Week we have used our class assembly time to conduct a few enquiries.

Linking to our work on evolution and animal adaptations the Year 5s were challenged to create a moth that camouflaged in its habitat – the playground. We looked at different species of moth and their camouflage techniques – including the Hornet moth which disguises itself as a hornet to scare off predators. At the end of the day the Year 5s had to hide their moths around their habitat before the predators (their Year 1 reading buddies) were released to hunt them down! Pictured opposite are the very scary predators and the prey they managed to locate

In our next assembly we were inspired by Mrs Milne's dancing raisins that a couple of the class asked "can any other fruit dance?"

We took some peas, carrots, bananas and satsumas and observed whether they too could sink and float like the raisins did. Turns out they couldn't! Although cutting some into smaller pieces did create different levels of flotation

Today we are going to carry out an experiment to prove that yeast (one of the microorganisms we have studied) does indeed respire using balloons to record how much gas is produced.









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BRITISH SCIENCE WEEK IN CLASS 4

During Science Week, Class 4 have been investigating how liquids can stain our teeth and finding out how much sugar there is the soft drinks we enjoy. We placed eggs (the shells are similar to our teeth) in different, sugary and acidic liquids, left them for 2 days and then observed any changes. They had all stained the eggs except the ones with toothpaste on them! So the message is...make sure you clean your teeth every day!





Did you know that an egg left in vinegar loses its shell, expands, and bounces on the floor before exploding?! We also discovered that orange and apple juices have the most sugar in them – up to 9 cubes of sugar in a 330ml bottle!
