FRONT ENTRANCE

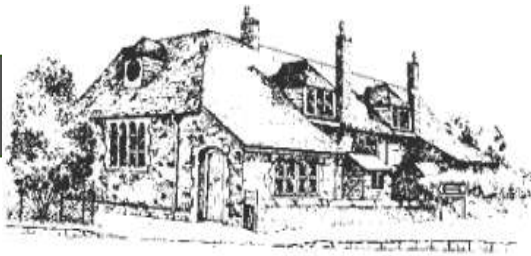
