Listen to a variety of stories.
Predict what may happen.

EYFS Literacy

Blend sounds into words, so that they can read short words made up of known letter - sound correspondences.
Read some letter groups that each represent one sound and say sounds for them.
Form lower case and capital letters correctly.
Spell words by identifying the sounds and then writing the sound with letter/s.
Write short sentences with words with known letter-sound correspondences using a capital letter and full stop.

EYFS Mathematics
Count beyond 10
Automatically recall number bonds for numbers 0-10
Compare length, weight and capacity.
Explore the composition of numbers to 10.
Select, rotate and manipulate shapes in order to develop spatial reasoning skills.
Compose and decompose shapes do that children can recognise a shape can have other shapes within it, just as numbers can.

Phonics - Phonics Bug
Revision of Phase 3 phonemes, digraphs, trigraphs and tricky words.
Introducing Phase 4 beginning and ending digraphs

Phonemes:
j, v, w, x, y, z, zz, qu, ch, sh, th, ng, ai, ee, igh, oa, oo, ar, or, ur, ow, oi, ear, air, ure, ur as er
Tricky words:
he, she, we, me, be, you, are, all, her, was, they, my

EYFS Understanding the world

Recognise some similarities and differences between life in this country and life in other countries.
Explore the natural world around them.
Describe what they see, hear and feel whilst outside.
Recognise some environments that are different to the one in which they live.
Understand the effect of changing seasons on the natural world around them.
